Stroke can happen at any age



Learn the F.A.S.T. signs and other signs of stroke in children.

	F ACE <i>drooped?</i>
	A RM <i>can't be raised?</i>
	S PEECH <i>slurred or confused?</i>
	T IME <i>is critical! Call 000.</i>

- › Weakness or numbness in the face, arm or leg, especially on one side.
- › Trouble seeing or vision loss.
- › Dizziness, loss of balance or poor coordination.
- › Severe, sudden headache, especially with nausea and vomiting.
- › Seizures with weakness that doesn't improve.
- › Loss of consciousness.
- › Trouble swallowing, including drooling.

If you see any of these signs act F.A.S.T. – call triple zero (000).
